Following on from the meeting with Tacey Onslow regarding **the proposal for railings along the site of the footpath to the school**, WCC Highway have visited the site and noted that the road leading up to the school and the allotments is not part of WCC Highway. Tracey made a suggestion for an extra speed hump to be installed at the bottom of the driveway.

Actions

It was decided that the suggested speed hump will not address the problem, so we will not pursue this.

2. New School Website, parents are happy with the new school website they find it easy to navigate and quicker than trawling through newsletters.

Actions

Photos to be updated termly to keep the website up to date.

3. E-Safety 'how safe is your child'? The internet is amazing. Children can play, learn, create and connect - opening up a whole world of exciting possibilities. But with the digital world changing all the time, how can you make sure your child's staying safe?

Actions

An E-Safety 'how safe is your child'? workshop is being run on 26/06/2018 at 2:15pm it is to be advertised on Facebook. Specific invitations to go out for families who have expressed concern. Letters to have reply slips so we know numbers. Refreshments will be available.

4. End of the school day KS2 playground, the playground is being used after school whilst parents are waiting for KS2 children to come out of class. Some complaints have been received about parents not supervising their children and this causes concern.

Actions

Set of playground rules to go out to KS1 and EYFS parents regarding the rules and ask them to supervise their children in accordance with these.

5. Street parking, there has been an issue on Greatfield Road regarding parents parking over driveways and fully on the pavement.

Actions

Clarification to be sought from the police regarding parking, a letter to go out to the parents and the local residents with the results.

6. Any Other Business, Snow Day protocol

Actions

The schools policy for snow days is that Mr Dallaway attends site at 6am that morning and assesses the safety and accessibility of the site. Mr Dallaway then contacts Miss Crawley to discuss the site and Miss Crawley then makes the decision in agreement with the chair of governors on whether the school will open. This decision is not taken lightly and the headteacher's job is to protect the safety of the pupils and staff whilst providing high quality education. If Miss Crawley can get the school open safely it will open.

There is also the potential for the Local authority to force closure.
