Every child came home with a letter and a consent form following the recent changes to data protection law. The consent form was due back on Wednesday so if you haven't completed and returned the paperwork, please make sure you do so on Monday. It needs to be returned to the office. Just a reminder that any changes to any details on the form need to be made in writing - we cannot take the information verbally. If you have any queries please speak to Mrs Nicholls.



Next week, every child will be coming home with a new Autumn/Winter menu from our caterers, AiP. These will start in September. These need to be completed and returned to the office **by Friday 29th June** and if you pay for your child's lunches, payment for the first week back (Wednesday 5th, Thursday 6th and Friday 7th September) must be paid by Friday 20th July. Please be reminded that payment needs to be made in advance and we politely request that you don't place orders on the day.



If your child is currently in Year 2, please note that they will not be entitled to 'Universal Infant Free School Meals' (UIFSM) when they go into Year 3. If you believe that you may be eligible for 'Free School Meals' (FSM) please speak to the office for an application form.



Polite reminder - if you are sending money into school, it must be in a clearly labelled envelope with your child's name, class, how much money is enclosed and what it is for. Please do not send in loose change with your child or hand it in at the office unless it's in an envelope. Payments for lunch, uniform and Friends of Sutton Park do need to be in cash but our preferred method of payment for everything else is via Payments4School.
