PSHE/Thrive



Year 5 Topic Web

French

The children will continue to develop their French skills by applying their knowledge in conversation with their peers. Children will also be learning about food.

PE

Year 5 will be developing the skills needed to play tennis. In addition to this, we will be participating in a range of athletic activities.

History

During this term, Year 5 will be finding out about the history of the area in which we live: Kidderminster. We will consider how Kidderminster has changed over the years and investigate what makes Kidderminster an interesting place to live.

Maths

This term we will be further developing our number skills ensuring we can read, write, order, round and compare numbers up to 1,000,000 and be able to determine the digit within each number. We will also be comparing and ordering fractions with a range of denominators and we will investigate the relationship between fractions and decimals, round decimals and order them up to 3 decimal places. In addition to this, we will be solving problems involving time, including converting between units of time. Finally, we will be revisiting our four operations and developing our problems solving skills. We will also further investigate square and cube numbers.

This half term for home learning, we expect children to be reading daily (this should be recorded in diaries), as well as practising times tables and spellings in preparation of weekly tests.
