## Topic Web Year 2

We have chosen this topic to build on our prior learning and further our knowledge of word classes, descriptive language and storytelling techniques.

# Sea Adventures

Outdoor PE will be on Thursday afternoons. Indoor PE will be on Monday afternoons. **Family reading will be on Wednesday afternoons, 2.45pm.**

### English

To develop our writing skills, we will be reading a range of sea-themed fiction texts; we will be using these to help us write descriptive stories, letters and diaries. We will be focusing on the features needed to be a Year two writer and learning how to apply them in different contexts. To support the writing process, pupils will create their own story maps and develop their verbal skills through oral rehearsal.

### Guided reading

To develop as readers, we will be continuing to widen our reading comprehension skills, answering questions about a text we have read. We will recognise simple recurring literary language in stories and poetry. Furthermore, we will be continuing to develop our fluency of reading, working up to reading 90 words a minute!



### Music

To improve our music skills, we will be composing our own music, which we will be using later in the term as part of our dance scheme of work.

### Science

To develop as scientists, we will be identifying and comparing the suitability of a variety of everyday materials for particular uses; discovering changes to solid objects by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. We will test materials' suitability to make a waterproof coat for Noi's father, one of the main characters from our class text.

### PE

In indoor PE, we will be exploring moving and balancing using various equipment and learning how to use and pack away equipment safely. During outdoor PE, we will be developing our throwing, catching and aiming skills.

### Geography

To develop our geography skills, we will name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas. We will be using basic geographical vocabulary to describe human and physical features. We will also be exploring maps and identifying features on aerial photos and plans.

### PSHE and Thrive

During this half term, we will continue to explore the theme: What keeps me healthy?

### RE

We will be exploring how we should care for others and the world, and why it is important.

### Maths

To improve as Mathematicians, we will be counting in steps of 2, 3 and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forward and backward. We will read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words. In addition to this, we will be comparing and ordering lengths and mass. Addition and subtraction will also be a focus this half term, where children will recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently and derive and use related facts up to 100 as well as adding and subtracting numbers mentally. We will also be exploring 2D and 3D shapes. In addition to this, arithmetic sessions will be used to explore and secure knowledge and understanding of the 4 number operations. Mental Maths sessions will be used to practise and consolidate facts for the 2, 5 and 10 x tables.
