Describe how it looks/smells/tastes/feels/sounds. Does anything special happen when it is eaten? Draw and colour your invention ready for tomorrow.

Today Y2's/ Y4's please start by practising your timestables on www.trockstars.com. YR's/ Y1's please practise counting backwards from 20 to 0. We are recapping ordering numbers in Maths today. Play the game 'Coconut Ordering'. YR and Y1's start on numbers up to 20. Y2/4's start on numbers up to 100 (and then up to 1000 if you are ready for the challenge!).
