Some of you suggested some topics for our new term ahead and so we are going to look at 'mini' topics – a few weeks at a time. We are going to start by looking at 'People Who Help Us'. English Task Try to practise your phonics daily with Read Write Inc sessions on You Tube. Also try reading for 10-20 minutes each day. You could play a phonics game on www.phonicsplay.co.uk. Why don't you try 'Pick a Picture'?

So, are you ready for our new mini topic 'People Who Help Us'? Today I would like you to think of all the people who are helping us in different ways, whilst we are staying at home to stay safe from spreading the coronavirus. Draw and label as many different people that you can think of that are helping us. Have a chat with a grown-up and see if they have any more ideas that you can add. We are going to think about different people each day.

Maths Task Today Y2's/ Y4's please start by practising your timestables on www.trockstars.com. YR's/ Y1's please practise counting in 10's from 0 to 100. This week we are thinking about using money. Ask a grown-up if you can borrow some coins (up to £2). Can you name each coin? Can you order the coins in order of value? Let's start by playing <https://www.topmarks.co.uk/money/toy-shop-money>. Choose 'mixed coins' then 'exact money' and 'up to 20p' and make the correct amounts to buy the toy. If this is too easy try increasing the value of coins or notes used.

Foundation Subject Task

Today I would like you to do some Art. I would like you to draw and colour something by observing it. It might be something in your garden (e.g. flower) or something you can see out of the window (e.g. tree) or something in your house (e.g. an apple). Think about the size you are going to draw it and the colours you need. Take your time and colour carefully. Can your family guess the object you have drawn?

I hope that you enjoy completing today's tasks. Don't forget to stay active and try and do some exercise every day. I know most of you have received your speech work packs from Miss Chatterton.
