English Task


Phonics: If you are able to search Ruth Miskin Training on You Tube or on Facebook, try out another lesson that focus on set 2 and set 3 sounds. Try this link... https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFClg9GdxtQ
If not, can you think of words with the sound ea (as in tea) and oi (as in soil) make and write them in a silly sentence. E.g. I met an alien and had a cup of tea.
Today we would like you watch this story about a blue butterfly
<https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/stories?page=2>. Watch together and talk about what happened in story. What do you already know about butterflies?
Can you describe the butterfly? If you can not access the link then have a chat about what you know about butterflies. (Your child maybe able to talk about the story 'The hungry caterpillar'.)

Maths Task

Ordering numbers. Try out this game; <https://www.topmarks.co.uk/ordering-and-sequencing/caterpillar-ordering> You can select your own number range to make it easier or harder for your child and you can count forwards and back. If not, write down 5 different numbers 0-100 for your child to put in order.
Thinking about time; Can you count to 60? If you have a clock with a second hand or a digital watch with a stopwatch, can you count in time with it? This is 60 seconds! What can you do in 60 seconds? How many times can you write your name? How many star jumps can you do? What else can you do in 60 seconds?

Foundation Subject Task

Art: Can you make create a butterfly picture. You could make it using paint and folding the picture in half to make a symmetrical pattern. Or you could cut and stick coloured paper on to the shape of a butterfly or just use felt tips or crayons. Make is as colourful as you can.

We hope you enjoy your tasks today. Don't forget it is really important to spend some time during the week reading with your child. You will have received a pack with a reading book matched to your child's reading ability. Please re-read this book at least 3 times as this will support your child to read fluently. If there are any words they get stuck on, write these words out so your child can practise it and then challenge them to find this word in the book next time you read it.
