### English Task

#### **Tips:**

Break the instructions into small steps.

Number or bullet point each instruction.

Use imperative (bossy) verbs. (An **imperative verb** is one that tells someone to do something, so that the sentence it is in becomes an order or command. E.g. Wash your hands!).

Include diagrams/pictures.

### Maths Task


To begin, I would like you to Log in to Times Tables Rockstar's <https://trockstars.com/> and complete work on your times tables for 10 minutes.

#### Fractions

Can you remember how to write one half, one quarter and one third using numbers?

Compare fractions using > (greater than), < (less than) and = (equal to/the same as) symbols.

**Remember that you used these symbols when you compared how much a container holds!**
