### English Task

You should have read chapters 1 and 2 of 'Riddle of the Runes' now so are starting to get to know Alva and Fennir. Using what you have learnt so far, draw an outline of Alva (big enough so that you can write inside it). Inside, write her thoughts and feelings so far – use evidence from the text here e.g. 'I hope I don't get hurt on this journey' and outside of the body outline, describe what she looks like, how she moves and how she behaves e.g. matted, red hair.



### Maths Task

BANK. You will need: • 2 players • 9 sided dice • Something to record scores.

How to play: The aim of this game is to be the first player to get to 50. The first player rolls the dice twice and finds the sum (total when adding). They can keep rolling as long as they want, adding all of the numbers to the sum. They can stop at any time, write down the score for that round (bank it) and pass the dice to the other player. It sounds like a good idea to keep playing, but... be warned! It could go wrong if you play too long. If you roll a 1 then that turns your score for that round to '0' and ends your go. Any totals saved in the bank are safe. Keep adding your scores in the bank together until a player gets to the target number. Make it harder by upping the target number to 100, 150 etc. Have fun!

### Foundation Subject Task

Large, round wooden shields were used by the Vikings to defend against attacks. Typical Viking shields were 80-90cm across with an iron boss at the centre to protect the hand. Viking shields were very effective at defending Viking warriors. They were used to deflect attacks, push attacks offline and spread the shock of a blow.

The Viking shield protected most of a warrior's body, leaving only the head and legs exposed. As a result, many Viking warrior remains show evidence of wounds to the head and legs. I would like you to design your own Viking shield. You can either do this by drawing a design or making a model of a shield. Have a look at the [Viking art symbols](#) to see the kinds of patterns and designs you could include.
