English Task

Remind yourself of chapter 3 in Gladiator Clash. Tom and Isis are stuck, and she asks the ring for help. On page 42 there is a riddle which uses rhyming words. Can you work out the rhyming pattern? Make a list of the words that rhyme. I would now like you to think up some rhyming words of your own. Using the same pattern as the riddle, I would like you to create a riddle about an object for someone in your family to solve. You could even send it to me to try and guess!

I hope you enjoy creating your riddles. Remember as you read your chapters to continue to make a note of any interesting or high-quality vocabulary and add it to your dictionary you started last week.

Maths Task

Using your dice from your pack, roll it 6 times and get 6 different digits. Make a note of these at the top of your page. Once you have done this, roll the dice 3 times to create a 3-digit number. This is now your target number.

Your challenge is to use the 6 digits at the top of your page to get as close to your target number. You can use any calculation you like (add, subtract, multiply and divide) but you can only use each digit once. If this is a bit tricky, start with a 2-digit target number.

Foundation Subject Task

Miss McGowan has set a family Music challenge for you today. The challenge is for your family to become musicians and to create an orchestra or band! This can be achieved by using whatever resources you have around your home. You could use pots and pans, pencils and twigs, the Hoover, any suitable and safe household objects or even yourself to make interesting sounds! All you really need to do is get creative and be brave to compose your own song with your new 'instruments', or play along to a song that you and your family love.
