A pentagon has 5 sides. Draw at least 4 different irregular pentagons.

A hexagon has 6 sides. Draw at least 4 different irregular hexagons.

An octagon has 8 sides. Draw at least 4 different irregular octagons.

**Can you name these shapes?**



**Key words:**

**Regular shapes** have sides that are all equal and interior (inside) angles that are all equal.

**Irregular shapes** have sides and angles of any length and size.
