

Yggdrasil - Old Norse - immense tree that connects the nine worlds in Norse





Thor's hammer - In Norse mythology, **Mjölner** is the hammer of Thor, a major Norse god associated with thunder. **Mjölner** is depicted in Norse mythology as one of the most fearsome weapons, capable of levelling mountains.


Huginn & Muninn - In Norse mythology, Huginn (from Old Norse "thought") and Muninn (Old Norse "memory" or "mind") are a pair of ravens that fly all over the world, Midgard, and bring information to the God Odin.




Web of Wyrð – a person's fate or destiny.

Also, the name of one of the Norns (female goddess giants) who spin the threads of fate at the foot of Yggdrasil, the tree of the world, using the water from the well Urdabrunnr.

Valknot – the "knot of the slain" is the symbolic sign of the coming together of the powers from the 9 worlds of the universe. This is the symbol of Odin.

"Odin's Chosen". Rune symbol often called Knot of the slain, wearer's shall die in service to Odin







Odin`s Horn - The Triple Horn of Odin is made of three interlocking drinking horns, and represents Odin, the father of Norse gods.



Sleipnir- In Norse mythology, Odin, the father of all gods, rides on an eight-legged horse named Sleipnir.



Gungnir- Odin's magical spear; it always hits its mark and always kills.





Helm of Awe-

a powerful protective symbol used for the purpose of protection from illness and enemies.

The meaning of the word awe is to strike with fear and reverence; to influence by fear, terror or respect.

Jormundgandr – the Midgard serpent. (Often written as Jormungand or World Serpent,) it is a sea serpent, the middle child of the giantess Angrboða and Loki.



According to Norse folklore, Odin took Loki's three children, Fenrisulfr, Hel and Jormungandr, and tossed Jormungandr into the great ocean that encircles Midgard. The serpent grew so large that he was able to surround the Earth and grasp his own tail. When he lets go the world will end.
