English Task Please practise your phonics daily with Read Write Inc reading and spelling sessions on You Tube. Please try reading for 10-20 minutes each day. I am watching www.getepic.com carefully to see how many books you are reading on this website!

We are going to be thinking about the story 'Shark in the Park' for the next 2 weeks. This story is a picture book by a famous author and illustrator Nick Sharratt. Today we are going to start by listening to Nick Sharratt read his story by watching the following videoclip. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=nWRwBRVeGQs>. Talk with a grownup about the setting (where?) for the story and the different characters in the story (who?). You can then have a go at drawing one of the characters with Nick in the videoclip. You may also want to learn more about the author on his website at www.nicksharratt.com and play some of the games or following his drawing tips.

Maths Task

Everyone start by playing 'Maths Fishing'. **Y1's** and **YR's** doubles and **Y2's** practise your times tables at <https://mathsframe.co.uk/en/resources/resource/306/Maths-Fishing-Multiplication>

Today I would like **YR's/ Y1's** to count on in 10's. Group objects into 10 e.g. 10 sticks/ 10 sweets/ 10 leaves and then practise counting 10..20..30.. to 100. Can you record the tens number correctly?

Y2's look at the video <https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-2> (Summer Term, Week 6 (1st June) lesson 1 – the 10 times table. Record the 10 times table on paper. Can you spot the pattern? If so, can you then work out 13x10, 15x10, 18 x 10 and 20 x 10?

Foundation Subject Task

Mrs Digger has set a family Geography challenge for you today. Your challenge is to create a 'Map' of your daily walk. Think about where you go on your daily walk. Which landmarks will you see along your journey, maybe a school, church, friend's house, can you draw these landmarks? If you are not leaving your house at the moment, or do not have a garden of your own, it could be that you choose to draw a map of the inside of your house, maybe from your bedroom to the kitchen. Can you draw a pathway of what you see along your route, do you have to go down the stairs, past the front door? Email a picture of your map and your name to your class email address. We will display some of the best maps on our school website. Visit the whole school resources page and click on the '**Staying Active, Fresh Air and Sunlight**' button for more information and a preview of Mrs Digger's example. Have fun!!!
