Maths Task



Today I would like **YR**'s/ **Y1**'s to please complete 'Is that a Shark?' size ordering worksheet (attached).

Think about your 10 times table e.g. $2 \times 10 = 20$ so 20 shared between 10 is 2 ($20 \div 10 = 2$) Can you record division number sentences (sharing) for the rest of the 10 times table?

Today I would like you to do some DT by constructing your own telescope (from 'Shark in the Park') or a pair of binoculars. You may need kitchen roll tubes or a large piece of paper/ roll of wrapping paper. Can you work out how to do it? You could act out the story 'Shark in the Park' using your telescope.
