**English Task** Please practise your phonics daily with Read Write Inc reading and spelling sessions on You Tube. Please try reading for 10-20 minutes each day.

Remind yourself of the story 'Shark in the Park' by Nick Sharratt.

e.g. 'A shark? Oh **no**!

It's just a **crow**'.

Can you think of your own animals and create a rhyming couplet? Write down your ideas.

e.g. A shark, what's **that**?!

It's only a **cat**!

**Maths Task** Today Y2's/ Y4's please start by practising your timestables on [www.trockstars.com](http://www.trockstars.com). YR's/ Y1's please practise writing your numbers correctly. Start 0-20 and then try 0-50 (or even 100!)

YR's/ Y1's use <https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/> (Summer Term, Week 6 (wk 1<sup>st</sup> June) lesson 3- introduce capacity and volume. Then using a small cup, measure how many cups it takes to fill other containers in your house e.g. 5 cups of water to fill the vase. Can you talk about this to a grown up?

**Y2's/ Y4** please complete the attached worksheet 'odd and even numbers investigation'. Remember to use objects to help you see if numbers are odd or even (can be paired into two).

### Foundation Subject Task

Many of you have coloured rainbows on posters to support doctors and nurses at the moment. Today I would like you to do a Science experiment to create a rainbow.

1. Cut a kitchen roll into the shape of a rainbow.
2. At each end, use felt-tip pens to colour a rainbow about 2cm up from the bottom. Remember the order of the colours: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, violet.
3. Attach a paperclip to the top of the rainbow and tie a piece of thread to it. This will allow you to hold your rainbow.
4. Add water to two bowls.
5. Hold the rainbow with both ends slightly submerged into each bowl of water and watch your rainbow grow.
