Good morning Language Class. Here are your activities for today. Keep up the super work!

English Task

Please practise your phonics daily with Read Write Inc reading and spelling sessions on You Tube. You should be practising your set 3 sounds. Please try reading for 10-20 minutes each day. Have you learnt the next 5 spellings on your list?

In 'Shark in the Park on a Windy Day' Nick Sharratt uses lots of adjectives (describing words) to describe the things that Timothy sees e.g. **big, friendly** dog. Watch <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=R2RwvAHUAdc> again. Can you make a list of the adjectives used in the book and add some of your own ideas to this list? How many more adjectives can you think of? Can you write some descriptive sentences for other things that Timothy may see at the park e.g. Timothy sees a tall, leafy pine tree. Etc.

Maths Task

Today Y2's/ Y4's please start by practising your timestables on www.trockstars.com . YR's/ Y1's please practise writing your numbers correctly. Start 0-20 and then try 0-50 (or even 100!)

Today we are thinking about symmetry again. Start by playing 'Symmetry Sorting' - try each activity (pictures, shapes and letters)

Foundation Subject Task

Today I would like you to think about the weather. Earlier in the term you completed your own weather chart. I have attached another chart if you would like to repeat that. The weather was very windy in the story 'Shark in the Park on a Windy Day'. Watch this video about extreme windy weather – called a tornado <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-s3UwOqIPIE> . Can you find out about different types of extreme weather that we might have in this country? (e.g. floods, gales) and in other parts of the world e.g. (hurricanes, droughts etc?) Make a list of different types and talk about what happens in these weather conditions.
