Multiplication and division

Find 2 different ways that 20 sweets could be put inside bags, so that each bag has exactly the same amount.

Now add 10 more sweets. How many sweets do you have now?

Find a way that they could be bagged up for 6 children, so that they all receive the same amount.

Make up a word problem to go with these calculations:

$$45 \div 5 =$$

$$24 \div 12 =$$

$$60 \div 10 =$$

$$60 \div 5 =$$
