English Task Please practise your phonics daily with Read Write Inc reading and spelling sessions on You Tube. You should be practising your set 3 sounds. Please try reading for 10-20 minutes each day. Please learn the next 5 spellings on your list?

Today we are going to change the beginning of 'Shark in the Park on a Windy Day' to make your own original story start. Change the adjective 'windy' for another adjective describing the weather e.g. 'Shark in the Park on a **Stormy** Day' etc. Rewatch the beginning of the story and change it for your own ideas

Try repeating this using a different type of weather each time. How many different story starts can you create?

Maths Task Today Y2's/ Y4's please start by practising your timestables on www.trockstars.com. YR's/ Y1's please practise writing your numbers correctly. Start 0-20 and then try 0-50 (or even 100!)

Today we are thinking about lines of symmetry. YR/Y1's play the activities from yesterday again then try and find objects that are symmetrical in your home or garden (use a mirror if you can to test this!). Y2's/4's play
