### English/Transition Task

As usual, I would like you to complete some independent reading of a book of your choice. This can be online or hard copy. It would be great if you could let me know what you are currently reading.

Recently, there have been protests across America, in the UK and in other countries around the world. Many of these have been peaceful, but there have also been fires and violence.

The protests began as a response to the death of a man named George Floyd in Minneapolis, a city in the US. A former Minneapolis police officer has been arrested and charged with murder over George's death.

For today's task, I want you to think about the following questions, and give reasons whether you think they are an appropriate action to take. Write a small paragraph for each statement explaining your views.

Not playing with someone because they have a **different skin colour** to you.



Helping someone who is from the **same country as you before helping others.**



Being friends with someone who has a **different religion** to you.

Using a nickname for someone who **comes from a different country.**



Being **treated the same**, regardless of your race or religion.



**Asking questions about someone's culture** when it is different to yours.

### Maths Task

For today's Maths challenge I want you to solve the Rugby Union problem.

#### Rugby union scores ...

In a rugby union match scores can be made by the following methods:

A try and a conversion 7 points

A try not converted 5 points

A penalty goal 3 points

A drop goal 3 points

In a game Harlequins beat Leicester by 21 points to 18.

The points were scored in this way:

Harlequins: 1 converted try, 1 try not converted, 2 penalties and a drop goal.

Leicester: 3 tries not converted and a drop goal.

Are there any other ways the points might have been scored?

### Young Enterprise/Foundation Task

Today I want you to think again about your product that you are going to design and make for your Young Enterprise Challenge. Remember, I want you to think of an invention that would help achieve something that has become harder to do during the recent corona virus pandemic. You will not be actually selling this product this year, but you will be able to design and present it.

From your interview results and your own ideas, I would like you to create a list of possible inventions that you could design for the task and give reasons why you think they would be effective. I would love to see your ideas, so make sure you send them to the year 6 email.
