Welcome Comment

Good morning Language Class. Here are your activities for today. Have a lovely weekend.

English Task Can you start today with a spelling test please? Ask a grown up to test you with 10 words from your spelling list. Please try reading for 10-20 minutes as well today.

I would like you to use any words from your spelling test that you spelt incorrectly and then the next words on your list to write at least 5 sentences today. Use one spelling word per sentence. Can you make these sentences interesting and using a 'joining word' e.g. 'and', 'but', 'because' etc. You could try and link them to the weather as we have been thinking about this and our story 'Shark in the Park on a Windy Day'. Don't forget finger spaces, capital letters and full stops, question marks and exclamation marks.

e.g. spelling word = some

1. The weather forecast reported there would be spells of cloudy and **some** sunny weather on Friday afternoon.

Maths Task Y2's/4's please ask a grown up to give you a timestable test. YR's and Y1's find numbers around your home. Can you find one-digit, two-digit and three-digit numbers? How many can you read correctly?

Today we are looking at direction. Watch <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/z7kwmp3>. Can you direct someone in your family around a track you've set up? Do they need to go left? Right? Forwards? Backwards? Turn? A half turn? A quarter turn? We have looked at this before but you may need to talk about it with a grown up to recap directions. Then Y2/4's can try the worksheet 'Animals turning'. This is a challenge and you may need help to learn that 'clockwise' means to turn the same way as the numbers in order around a clock and that 'anticlockwise' is turning the opposite way to the order of numbers around a clock. Good Luck!

Foundation Subject Task

Today I would like you to be a weather forecaster. Pretend you are on the television and give a weather forecast for the weekend. You could use your weather symbols from yesterday. You might pretend that there is going to be extreme weather in Kidderminster! Can you present your weather forecast to your family? Have fun!
