English Task

Word of the week:

Word: vibrant (adjective)

Definition: Full of energy and life.

The artist used vibrant colours to make the painting eye-catching.

Synonym (words with similar meanings): lively, energetic, vivid.

This week, we are focusing on 'oy' and 'oi' words: **toy** for a **boy**; **spoil** the **boy**. Read through the phoneme spotter story, which is saved in the Year 2 Home Learning section. Highlight the words containing 'oy' or 'oi'. Then, make a list of these words. What do you notice? Can you add your own words containing 'oy' or 'oi'?

With support, select 10 spellings that you need to practise. Practise the words throughout the week, in any way you wish. You could try roll and spell or write them in chalk outside. Get a grown-up to test you on Friday.
