English Task

Remember a sentence needs a capital letter at the start, finger spaces between each word and a full stop at the end of the sentence. Make sure the spelling is correct too!

Maths Task

Today we would like you to continue with fractions. With help from a grownup draw and cut out another circle, square, rectangle and triangle. Fold the shape in half and then half again. Draw the lines to show quarters. (Four equal parts). Colour in one quarter of each shape. Write one quarter or 1/4 next to it.

As an extra challenge... Are there any other ways you can show one quarter using these shapes?

If you are having pizza for tea you could help a grown up to cut the pizza in half and quarters. How many quarters make a whole? How many quarters make one half.

Foundation Subject Task

RE focus. Can you watch the story of 'Noah's Ark. This story is found in the Bible in the Old Testament. Talk about the story together and the message behind the story. What promise does God make at the end of the story?
