English Task

Today we would like you to focus on capital letters. Try this game...

 Try writing out all the capital letters A-Z on your whiteboards. Remember there needs to be a capital letter at the start of a sentence and at the start of a name (people and places)!
 Write out each sentence and correctly write a capital letter.

1. iack and alice have a pet cat called ginger.
2. queen elizabeth lives in a big city called london.
3. tim went on holiday to spain.

Maths

In Maths today we would like you to have a go at counting on and back in different patterns. Start with this game if you can. (Select sequencing then counting in 2s.)

 Then on your whiteboards or on paper write out these sequences;

1. Start with 12.... **count on** in 2s until you get to 30
2. Start with 13... **count on** in 2s until you get to 31
3. Start with 9... **count on** in 10s until you get to 59 (what pattern do you notice)
4. Start with 26... **count back** in 2s
5. Start with 29... **count back** in 2s

Foundation Subject Task

We will be continuing the theme of 'The Olympics'. Today we would like you to make up a whacky race with snails!! Use the instructions here to make your snail. (You can make a snail for your whole family too!) Then find a flat surface to place your snails, mark out a finishing line at the other end. Using a piece of paper like a fan, blow the snails across the surface to the finishing line. You can even make your own medals for 1st place (gold) 2nd place (silver) and 3rd place (bronze).



1 Decorate your large strip of paper on both sides with markings similar to those you have seen on snails outside.



2 Fold over 6cm of paper at one end and secure with glue to form the head.



3 On a flat surface, roll the paper at the opposite end around a pen or pencil to form a spiral.



4 Take the two smaller strips of paper and fold down approximately 5mm at one end of both to form the antennae. Now glue them to the snail's head
