Synonym (words with similar meanings): carry on, not give up.


English Task

The idea of the game is to test spelling and to show an understanding of homophones. For example, Monopoly: you could turn your chance cards into spelling the correct homophone in a given sentence. Be as creative as you wish. You will be finishing off your game and playing it in tomorrow's English session.

20 - 5


1 + 5

He buys this cap and jumper with his money.




How much money does he have left?
