


Sutton Park Primary RSA Academy Curriculum Map - Year 6

PE will be on a Monday and Wednesday afternoon. Please make sure your child has their named PE kit in school.



Rationale: In the autumn term, Year Six will be seeking to answer the question: 'How did working life change during the Victorian period and beyond?'. We will begin by gaining knowledge of the time period that the Victorians lived in and then compare areas such as living conditions, fashion and entertainment with our lives today. This, combined with having 'Oliver Twist' as a key text, will enable us to gain some real insight into this fascinating period in our history.

How did working life change during the Victorian period and beyond?

PSHE/RE/Thrive

In R.E, pupils will be studying Islam and what it means to be a Muslim in Britain today. Weekly PSHE and Thrive sessions will promote positive wellbeing and mental health.

English

We will begin the term by looking at the text 'The Wizard, the Ugly and the Book of Shame'. This will provide the children with an excellent stimulus for our characterisation writing. We will then further this by using parts of a fictional text set in the Victorian era called 'Oliver Twist', to stimulate the children's imaginations to use literacy skills such as adjectives and conjunctions in their writing. Elements of this text will provide the children with excellent extended writing opportunities in genres of writing such as:

- Diary entries
- Character description
- Setting description
- Newspaper reports
- Letters

PE

P.E. will consist of two main areas:
Football – We will be learning how to dribble with the ball at pace, practising several turns as we progress.
Cricket – We will learn how to catch and throw accurately, as well as to bowl using an over arm technique.

Music

We will be investigating pieces of music from the Victorian period and comparing them with other historical times. We will also begin to use ukuleles in class.

Science

On arrival back from their summer holidays, the children will be assessed in Science. This assessment will be analysed and areas which need revisiting in Year Six will then be covered over the autumn term. Key areas include:

- Electricity – Investigating circuits.
- The effect of exercise on the body.
- Life processes.
- Light and how it travels

History

In History we will be studying the Victorians and how work changed within this period? We will look what it was like to live during this time and compare that life with our own. We will then begin to study the development of the British Empire and this will link nicely into our next History topic of World War One.

KASE

Our curriculum is designed to ensure the children build their knowledge whilst having opportunities to develop important attributes like teamwork and empathy. We plan for a clear progression of skills and provide a wealth of experiences to further their engagement and understanding. We therefore call this our KASE curriculum.

French

Pupils will revise basic greetings and numbers. They will then quickly progress onto looking in detail at the capital of France - Paris, and will then tasked with creating a leaflet based on the city.

Art

Children will use the topic of the Victorians to complete many mini art projects including drawings based on Victorian street scenes.

D and T

We have been working on designing and creating our very own personal sewing motif, which will form part of a whole school display. Pupils will learn and practise various stitching skills from threading a needle to running/back stitches.

Computing

In Computing, we are going to investigate video games and what attracts us to them. We will then work to design and create a video game set in the 1900's in Scratch.

Maths

In Maths, pupils will begin by looking at the four main operations within number.

We will then look at:

- Area
- Fractions of Shapes/numbers (Equivalent)
- 2D shape review
- Properties of triangle
Identifying/measuring angles
- Mass/capacity
- multiplication tables

Mental Maths lessons will also be taught twice weekly, working on arithmetic and developing our quick recall of number facts and times tables.
