Curriculum Map – Year One
Autumn Term 2 2021

PE will be on Monday and Friday.
Make sure all items of clothes are clearly named. We have Forest School on Thursday mornings.

We have chosen this topic as the children are keen to share their ideas about their favourite toys and as they have personal experience of this it will support imaginative writing. It is also a great opportunity for you to talk to them about your childhood experiences too.

How have toys changed over the years?

Maths

In Maths we will continue to learn number bonds that make 10 and 20 and we will practise using them so we can add and subtract quickly. We will name and describe 2D shapes. We will practise counting in 2s, 5s 10s forwards and backwards and learn to write numbers to 100 in words.

In Maths we will also find half and quarter of a shape and a number. We will compare and describe capacity and volume using words like full, empty and half full.

PE.

In outdoor games we will continue to practise throwing, catching and rolling skills by aiming at simple targets. During our Gymnastic lessons we will be exploring with travelling along different pathways and learning new rolling techniques.

KASE Our curriculum is designed to ensure the children build their knowledge whilst having opportunities to develop important attributes like teamwork and empathy. We plan for a clear progression of skills and provide a wealth of experiences to further their engagement and understanding. We therefore call this our **KASE** curriculum.

History

We will learn about toys starting with modern toys and comparing them with toys from past. We will then learn how the teddy bear has changed over the years and place various types in order on a timeline. Later we will be finding out about how Queen Victoria & the Victorians celebrated Christmas.

Design Technology

As a class we will be designing and making our own Jack in the Box after exploring different techniques and structures to create the most effective mechanism.

Computing

We will use a program to create a firework picture then print it out. We will learn about Internet safety and how we must keep our password safe and personal information private.

Science

Are all wooden toys old? During our Science sessions we will name, identify and sort the materials that toys are made from. We will explore the suitability of the materials, discuss the properties and why they are appropriate for each toy.

RE

In RE we will continue to explore the values of 'belonging' with a focus on Christianity. Later this term we will learn about the significant people in the Christmas story.

Music

In Music we will explore the story of the Nutcracker by Tchaikovsky. Year One will listen to pieces of recorded music and discuss how the music makes them feel.



English

The class will be using the story of 'Toys in Space' by Mini Grey and clips from Toy Story to inspire our writing about a lost toy. We will consolidate our understanding of adjectives to describe our missing toys. Then we will innovate our own story starter using a story map and explore the feelings of a character using hot seating. We will use adjectives in our writing to make the sentences more interesting and we will extend our sentences with 'and' and 'because'. We will also learn how to add 'ed' to a verb. We will continue with daily Read Write Inc sessions to consolidate our knowledge of sounds and learn new ones.

PSHE/ Thrive

In Thrive we will continue to learn how to manage and resolve disagreements. As part of our PSHE focus this half term is 'Physical Health and Wellbeing. Our main topic is 'Fun Times' where we will choose to play suitable playground games and learn the importance of rules.
