Curriculum Map Year One

Summer Term 2 2022

What grows on a farm?

Rationale: This topic will enhance the children's interest in planting and growth. In Year One, we love to work outdoors and the stories we have chosen will give the class plenty of opportunities to learn outside the classroom and so inspire the children's writing and continue their 'love of reading'

PE will be on Monday and Friday. Please make sure all items of clothes are clearly named. We have Forest School on Thursday afternoons.

KASE

Our curriculum is designed to ensure the children build their **k**nowledge whilst having opportunities to develop important **a**tttributes like teamwork and empathy. We plan for a clear progression of **s**kills and provide a wealth of **e**xperiences to further their engagement and understanding. We therefore call this our **KASE** curriculum.

Maths

Year One will practise reading and writing numbers in words to 20 and will continue to learn addition and subtraction facts as well as solve problems related to multiplication and division. We will describe position, direction and movement, using the vocabulary half, quarter and three-quarter turns. Also, we will explore measures of length, capacity and time and compare and order items according to their measurements.

Art

During our Art sessions, we are looking at sculptures by Kenjojak Ashevak and learning to take inspiration from this artist and have a go at creating a piece of sculpture using recycled materials.

Science

To become Scientists, we will be describing how weather changes according to the seasons. We will also describe how the amount of daylight varies according to the seasons. This links to our learning about what plants need to grow and we will explore how weather is important for what grows on the farm.

Design and Technology

What grows on the farm? We will be exploring the importance of vegetables in our diet and learning how to peel, grate and season them by creating dips, pitta pockets and even breaded vegetables.

English

We will start our topic with the story The Little Red Hen and we will be retelling the story orally using 'Talk for Writing' actions. This will then help us to rewrite the story in our own words and in the correct order. The class will have lots of opportunities to reread their own writing to make sure it makes sense. 'What the Ladybird heard' is set on the farm and we will be using this story, written by Julia Donaldson, to create our story maps of how the two thieves stole the fine prize cow! We will continue with daily Read Write Inc sessions to consolidate our knowledge of sounds and learn new sounds too.

PE.

This half term we will be developing our athletics skills through practising different ways of travelling in preparation for our Sports morning.

PSHE / Thrive

This term we will be learning about money and where it comes from and we can save it or make choices on how to spend it. We will also explore the different jobs people can do to earn money.

RE

During our RE sessions we will be exploring how we should care for our world and for others and why it matters?

Music

In Music we will improvise in making sounds, including rhythms, pulses and different pitches with instruments and the voice.

Computing

In Year One we will be using Ipads and laptops to find out information about what can be found on the farm. We are learning to log into the laptops using our own unique usernames and passwords and understanding the importance of these security measures.
